

Workshop title: *East Asian Psycholinguistics: Recent developments*

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Description of the workshop: The workshop intends to gather people working on any topic of psycholinguistics with reference to East Asian languages such as Chinese, Japanese and Korean. The goal of the workshop is to highlight recent theoretical advances in language processing, and also to foster the scientific community working in these three languages. We solicit papers for 30 minute presentations (including discussion) investigating theoretical or methodological issues using experimental methods (ERPs, eye-tracking, computational modeling etc.). Topics of interest include, but are not limited to:

- Language comprehension
- Language production
- Lexical processing
- Sentence processing
- Discourse processing
- Computational modeling of language
- Neurobiology of language processing
- Language acquisition
- Multilingual language processing

Abstract format: Abstracts should be written in English, anonymous and a maximum of 500 words in length (excluding references). A separate page can be used to present experimental stimuli and results.
